







2016 NoKidHungry@MySchool Statewide Breakfast Challenge Results

No Kid Hungry NC celebrates the commitment of all schools who participated in the Breakfast Challenge to ensure that every child starts the day with a healthy breakfast.

- ✓ All 115 school districts in North Carolina were included in the Breakfast Challenge no sign up required.
- ✓ To reach more of our hungry children, the focus of this year's Breakfast Challenge was to move more of our state closer to the following ambitious *milestone goal*:

At least 70% of our low-income students who eat school lunch will also eat school breakfast.

- To determine the winners of the Breakfast Challenge at the school level, we used monthly "meal claims data" provided by the NC Department of Public Instruction (DPI) to compute **Participation Rate** and **Increase**.
 - Participation Rate = [(# of meals served / # of days served)] / # of students enrolled in school
 - o Increase = October 2016 Participation Rate minus October 2015 Participation Rate
- Among Challenge schools with the top 50 highest increases, increases ranged from 26% to 57%.
- The Breakfast Challenge Winners are the elementary, middle and high schools with the top 3 highest increases.
- To determine school districts meeting the 70% milestone goal, we used monthly "meal claims data" provided by the NC DPI to compute the ratio of free and reduced-price (FRP) breakfasts to FRP lunches served:
 - Ratio of FRP breakfasts to FRP lunches served = # FRP breakfasts served/# FRP lunches served
